## PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS OF THE MILITARY COMMITTEE, NATO

1. Purpose. This instruction establishes procedures for determining the US military position on military matters before the Military Committee of NATO.
2. Cancellation. CJCSI 2010.01B, 15 August 1997, is canceled.
3. Applicability. This instruction applies to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; Joint Staff; US Representative to the Military Committee (USMILREP); and the Delegation to the Military Committee (USDELMC).
4. Policy
  - a. The USMILREP and staff, known collectively as the USDELMC, will be guided by the following.
    - (1) NATO military matters on which existing US guidance is considered adequate by USMILREP will be processed as follows:
      - (a) During development of a proposed NATO military position, USDELMC will coordinate informally with directorates, as appropriate.
      - (b) If USMILREP considers a proposed NATO military position to be within the terms of established CJCS policy, it will be referred to the Secretary, Joint Staff (SJS), Actions Division, for distribution.

(c) In developing a final position, USMILREP will forward to SJS for CJCS approval any substantive deviations from previously established CJCS policy considered necessary to obtain a satisfactory international agreement.

(2) NATO military matters on which existing US guidance is considered inadequate by USMILREP will be processed as follows.

(a) During the development of a proposed NATO military position, USDELMC will coordinate informally with directorates, as appropriate.

(b) At the appropriate stage in development of the proposed NATO military position, USMILREP will submit the matter, with recommendations, to SJS for tasking to the appropriate Joint Staff directorate. USMILREP will follow the guidance provided by the Joint Staff in developing and negotiating an agreed NATO military position.

(c) In developing a final position, USMILREP will forward to SJS, recommending CJCS approval, any substantive deviations from previous CJCS guidance considered necessary to obtain a satisfactory international agreement.

b. The cognizant Joint Staff directorate will consult and coordinate with USDELMC and US members of multinational working groups supporting the Military Committee, providing informal advice, information, support and CJCS-approved guidance, as necessary. Additionally, the Joint Staff and DIA will provide assistance in coordinating with other appropriate US agencies. Multinational groups, agencies providing US representation and the cognizant Joint Staff directorate with primary responsibilities or interest are listed in Enclosure A.

c. The functional areas and cognizant Joint Staff directorates from which informal advice, information, support and CJCS-approved guidance will be provided to the USDELMC are listed in Enclosure B.

5. Definitions. N/A

6. Responsibilities

a. USMILREP will determine whether existing policy adequately covers the issue under consideration by the Military Committee.

b. SJS will distribute information to and task appropriate Joint Staff directorates.


c. Joint Staff directorates will provide informal coordination with USMILREP and formal responses to SJS tasking.
