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GENERAL INFORMATION

United States Joint Forces Command (USJFCOM) Joint Warfighting Center (JWFC) MISSION: To support joint and multi-national training and exercises focused on commanders, staffs, and component forces; assisting the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff (CJCS), and Service Chiefs in their preparation for joint and combined operations in their preparation for joint and combined operations; and to facilitate the conceptualization, development, and assessment of joint doctrine.

OVERVIEW: The JWFC is a USJFCOM organization designed to support all training and exercise programs throughout the joint training cycle. The USJFCOM JWFC is an on-line organization experienced in exercise support and doctrine development. The USJFCOM JWFC currently is developing joint training functions and capabilities.

JOINT COURSE AND COURSEWARE CATALOG DESCRIPTION: The Joint Course and Courseware Catalog (JCCC) is a reference of available joint training courses and joint training courseware that address aspects of joint and multinational operations. The primary purpose is to provide access to joint course information from a single, comprehensive source. The Services and their components, formal schools, individual CINC Staffs and other training sponsors and activities, provided inputs. All the courses submitted are included and the information listed for each course is as provided by the sponsoring activity. The JCCC is available in hard copy, on-line with the Joint Electronic Library (JEL), or as a formatted CD-ROM with the JEL. 

Title: **ADVANCED COUNTERTERRORISM ANALYSIS COURSE (ACAC)**

UJTL Reference: SN.2, SN.3; ST.8

Course Number: N/A

Objective: To enhance understanding of the collection and warning processes in the counterterrorism field; to evaluate and discuss intelligence challenges facing terrorism analysts; and to reinforce interaction and coordination among mid-level analysts in the Counterterrorism Community. ACAC is the mid-level course in the JMITC's three-tiered Community Counterterrorism Training Program.

Description: It emphasizes the pro-active analyst model– the analyst who engages in creative approaches to the terrorism problem and who understands the significant role of collection and warning in dealing with the terrorist threat. ACAC also examines, in detail, important international and domestic terrorism issues. A mixture of hands-on training, speakers, and discussion panels is utilized.

Audience: Mid-level, O-3/GS-11 or above intelligence analyst status in the Counterterrorism Community. Those of other grades or ranks, with one year or more of counterterrorism analysis may submit a waiver request with their nomination.

Clearance: TOP SECRET/SCI/TK

Prerequisites: Applicant must be serving in a counterterrorism analyst position. Attendance in the Counterterrorism Analysis Course (CAC) is recommended but not required. Enrollment is limited to US citizens who are federal government employees.

Title: COUNTERTERRORISM PERSPECTIVES FOR SENIOR MANAGERS (CTPSM) SEMINAR
UJTL Reference: SN.2, SN.3; ST.2; ST.8
Course Number: N/A
Objective: To enhance student understanding of counterterrorism and their role in assisting Community coordination and policy formulation; to enable students to develop requirements and direct resources in line with the changing nature of the terrorist threat. This seminar encourages discussion and a free-flow of ideas on a host of terrorist/counterterrorist-related subjects. This interaction not only is an objective in and of itself, but also reinforces the other instructional goals.
Description: CTPSM is the top-level course in the JMITC's three-tiered Community Counterterrorism Training Program. This is a dynamic seminar which takes into account the changing global environment and the evolving terrorist threat of the 1990's. As a result, the units of instruction/discussion vary depending on the current situation and the needs of the consumers. This adaptability is considered to be one of the most positive characteristics of the seminar. CTPSM focuses on the latest in Community developments, particularly in US CT policy, intelligence, legal, and technological issues.
Audience: Senior personnel (O-5/GS-14 or above) in counterterrorism management positions. Those of other grades or ranks (not below O-4/E-8/ GS-12) with counterterrorism responsibilities, may apply with a short waiver request included in their nomination.

Title: DEFENSE INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTION ANALYSIS COURSE (DIPAC)

UJTL Reference: SN.2

Course Number: N/A

Objective: To gain a broad perspective on analysis of foreign defense industries (including proliferation from other countries, arms control, and treaty verification) and an appreciation of the multifaceted activities, accomplishments, vulnerabilities, and weaknesses of foreign defense industrial operations.

Description: This course is an introduction to the procedures and methodologies used by the Defense Agency for analysis of foreign defense industrial activities and facilities. The skills presented in this course are intended to familiarize analysts responsible for defense industrial studies, proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and advanced conventional weapons, and arms control and treaty verification with the fundamentals of industrial analysis. Through lectures, discussion, practical exercises, and orientation visits to factories, the course provides hands-on experience with industrial analysts. It also describes the type of information required to build estimates of production, bottlenecks and vulnerabilities of factories to work stoppage and interdiction, and potential wartime surge, mobilization, and reconstitution of industrial operations.

Audience: Mid-level military and civilian personnel (O-3/O-5 and GS-11/13) who are engaged in foreign defense industrial analysis. Nominations must be coordinated through DIA/RAI-2 (Defense Industries Division.)

Objective: To provide knowledge of the national policies, rules and regulations that govern exchange agreements and the disclosure of military intelligence to foreign governments and international organizations.
Description: This is a new course. It has been developed by the Foreign Exchanges and Disclosures Office to meet the need for and the disclosure of military intelligence to foreign governments and international organizations. The course emphasizes the inherent need for foreign disclosure expertise in support of not only coalition operations but support to bilateral relationships as well. The course will provide instruction in determining what military intelligence may or may not be released based on existing policies. Methods taught apply to any intelligence discipline which may be used to support exchange and individual exercises.
Audience: Anyone who is or will be in a position which requires expertise on the sharing of military intelligence with a foreign government or international organizations. This course is open to all levels of civilian/military personnel. As with any DIA-sponsored training, every consideration will be given to the principles of Equal Employment Opportunity.

Title: COUNTERTERRORISM ANALYSIS COURSE (CAC)
UJTL Reference: SN.3, SN.2; ST.2, ST.8
Course Number: N/A
Objective: To understand major issues confronting counterterrorism analysts, the nature of the terrorist threat, US government organizations and actors involved in US counterterrorism efforts, and the tools and techniques for counterterrorism analysis.
Description: CAC is the entry-level course in the JMITC's three-tiered Community Counterterrorism Training Program. It introduces analysts to the substance and theory of counterterrorism intelligence analysis, and serves as the baseline for understanding the techniques, tools, procedures supporting timely intelligence on terrorist group behavior, modus operandi, plans, and targets. Requires successful completion of an intensive all-day exercise using the analytical methodologies taught in class. Each student briefs a portion of the exercise.
