1. PURPOSE: THIS MESSAGE ASSIGNS THE US ARMY AS LEAD AGENT AND JOINT STAFF J-3 AS THE JOINT STAFF DOCTRINE SPONSOR FOR THE REVISION OF JP 3-10, JOINT DOCTRINE FOR REAR AREA OPERATIONS.
2. BACKGROUND: THE DIRECTOR J-7 APPROVED THE JOINT DOCTRINE PUBLICATION CONSOLIDATION PLAN WHICH INCLUDES THE CONSOLIDATION OF JP 3-10, JOINT DOCTRINE FOR REAR AREA OPERATIONS (28 MAY 1996) AND JP 3-10.1, JOINT TACTICS, TECHNIQUES, AND PROCEDURES FOR BASE DEFENSE (23 JULY 1996) INTO THE REVISION OF JP 3-10. A REQUEST FOR FEEDBACK (RFF) WAS RELEASED 16 OCT 2002. USJFCOM JWFC ASSESSED THE UTILITY AND QUALITY OF THE CURRENT PUBLICATIONS. THE JWFC ASSESSMENT REPORT FINDINGS REFLECT ANALYSIS BASED ON DATA COLLECTED FROM NUMEROUS SOURCES, TO INCLUDE INPUTS FROM COMBATANT COMMANDS, SERVICES, AND THE JOINT STAFF. ADDITIONAL DATA WAS COLLECTED THROUGH SUBJECT MATTER EXPERT INTERVIEWS AND A REVIEW OF THE JOINT AFTER ACTION REPORTING SYSTEM AND JOINT ELECTRONIC LIBRARY DATABASES AND OTHER APPLICABLE DATABASES. JP 3-10 WILL BE REVISED IAW THE GUIDELINES ESTABLISHED IN REF A AND REF B.
3. SCOPE: THIS PUBLICATION PROVIDES GUIDELINES FOR PLANNING AND EXECUTING JOINT REAR AREA OPERATIONS LOCATED ON FOREIGN (OR NONUS) SOIL AND INCLUDES BASE DEFENSE FOR US BASES AND FACILITIES ON FOREIGN SOIL. THE PUBLICATION EXPLAINS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN REAR AREA OPERATIONS AND JOINT FORCE LOGISTIC OPERATIONS IN THE JOINT OPERATIONS AREA. THE FOCUS IS ON INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT AS WELL AS FORCE PROTECTION WITHIN THE JOINT REAR AREA WITH PARTICULAR EMPHASIS ON GUIDELINES FOR BASE COMMANDERS IN THE DEFENSE OF THEIR BASES. IT ADDRESSES COMMAND RELATIONSHIPS AND OTHER PERTINENT ISSUES ASSOCIATED WITH JOINT REAR AREA OPERATIONS AND DEFENSE OF BASES IN ADDITION TO OUTLINING THE JOINT REAR AREA COORDINATOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES. IT ALSO INCLUDES LOGISTIC FUNCTIONS OF SUSTAINMENT, MOVEMENTS, AND HOST-NATION SUPPORT.
