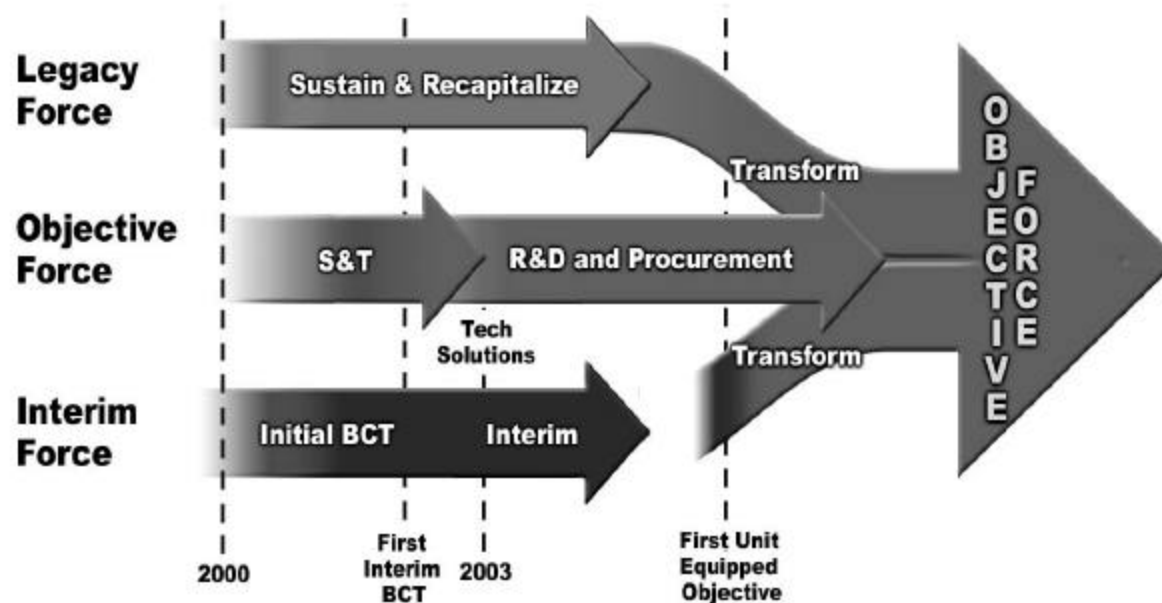

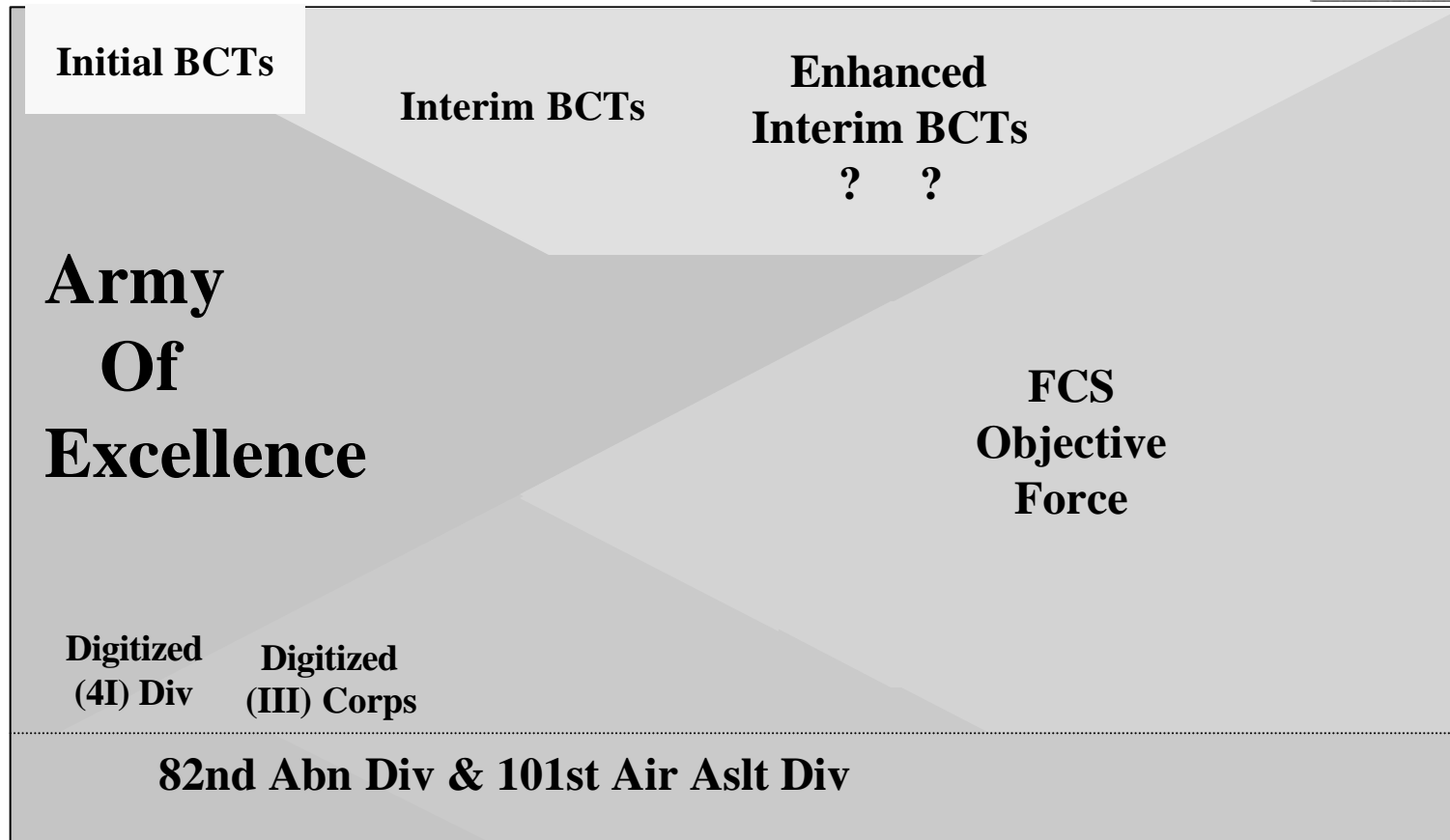

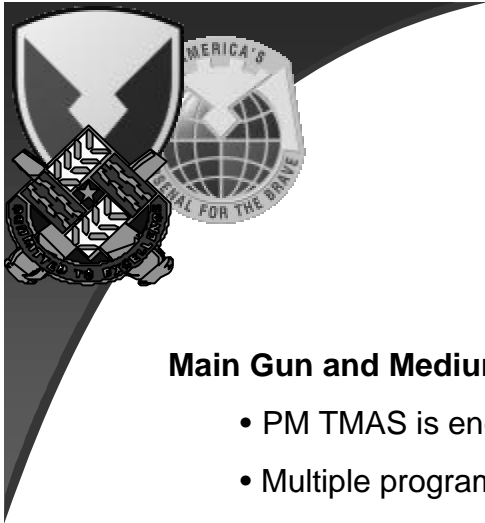

- Multiple programs provide a variety of essential lethality applications

Mortar Systems & Munitions (LTC Hollingsworth)

- The Army's Transformation strategy includes three major axis; TACOM and PM Mortars are intimately involved supporting all three axis.
- The 120mm mortar fire support found in the BCT, is three times greater (36 systems) than a conventional brigade (12 systems). The mortar, by design, becomes the maneuver commanders fire support weapon of choice in the Red Zone.
