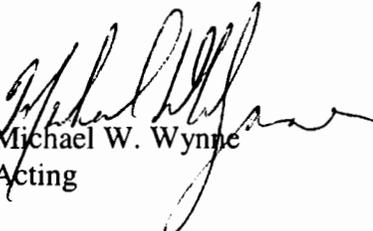
SUBJECT: Independent Research and Development

Defense contractors spend in excess of \$3 billion annually conducting independent research and development (IR&D). IR&D is research and development initiated and conducted by defense contractors independent of DoD control and without direct DoD funding.

I believe we can take better advantage of the sizable IR&D investment being made by defense contractors. Moreover, DoD policy (DoDD 3204.1) requires DoD personnel to consider the work and accomplishments of contractor IR&D when planning, programming, and budgeting for DoD R&D, and to enhance their knowledge of contractor IR&D by reviewing reports of contractor IR&D efforts. The policy also requires the Heads of DoD Components to ensure their staffs search the IR&D database prior to starting new projects to determine if the proposed work duplicates any contractor IR&D effort.

Information about contractor IR&D activities is available to DoD personnel through a secure Defense Technical Information Center (DTIC) database over the Internet. DoD personnel with access to the database can search over 165,000 IR&D project descriptions covering activities from the mid 1970s to the present. More than 2,100 new and updated IR&D project summaries are added to the database each year. Because contractor IR&D can make a significant contribution to our R&D efforts, I fully expect information in the IR&D database to be reviewed prior to initiating new R&D projects.
