US Joint Forces ... Who are we?

United States Joint Forces Command

A series of changes to the U.S. Unified Command Plan have resulted in *one unified CINC* as an advocate for jointness with responsibility for *leading the transformation* of the U.S. Armed Forces

•1993 UCP

- **COCOM of CONUS(-) general purpose forces**
- **Change from LANTCOM to USACOM**
- **Conduct Joint Training**

•1995 UCP

- **Conduct Joint Integration**
- **Transfer Caribbean region to USSOUTHCOM**

•1997 UCP

- **Trained and ready Joint Force Provider**
- **Conduct MSCA and MACDIS**

•1999 UCP

- **Joint Experimentation & JTF - Civil Support**
- **Redesignate as U.S. Joint Forces Command**
- **South Atlantic to SOUTHCOM/EUCOM**
- **Retain North Atlantic AOR & ACLANT**

An Expanded Charter

- **Joint Force Trainer**
- **Joint Force Interoperability**
- **Joint Force Requirements**
- **Joint Force Provider**
- **Joint Force Experimentation**

PLUS

- **Domestic missions**



New Mission and Vision

United States Joint Forces Command

MISSION: As the Chief Advocate for Jointness, USJFCOM maximizes the Nation's future and present military capabilities through joint concept development and experimentation, recommending joint requirements, advancing interoperability, conducting joint training, and providing ready CONUS-based forces and capabilities to support other CINCs, the Atlantic Theater, and domestic requirements.

VISION: U.S. Joint Forces Command leads the transformation of the United States Armed Forces to achieve full spectrum dominance as described in Joint Vision 2020.

- **fight to deceive us**




They will fight . . . count on it.
